# CAPC ADAPTIVE ART STUDIO AT THE LA MIRADA ACTIVITY CENTER IS NOW IN SESSION!



CAPC's Adaptive Art Studio is now in session through our valued partnership with the **City of La Mirada**, bringing together CAPC individuals and members of the community in a shared creative space. The class focuses on building skills, encouraging creativity, and creating a space where participants can connect with one another. In week 1, participants explored the theme "Paint with Your Emotions", using adaptive brushes and paint to express what they were feeling that day. In week 2, the group worked with recycled material to create unique works of art. The Adaptive Art Studio is a space for not only creating art, but also building confidence, trying new things, and being part of a community.

## JOIN US IN MAKING AN IMPACT

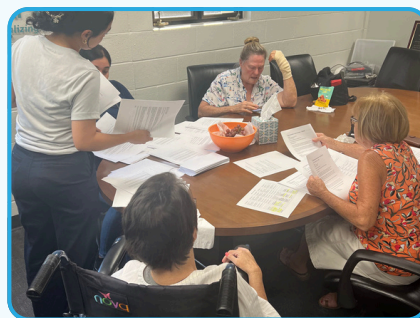

**We'll be writing letters to our Local State Legislators:**

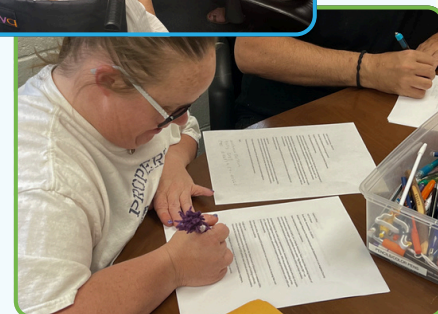
- Advocating to protect vital disability services
